Four films that explore other cultures: Cambodia, Argentina, France, and Mali.

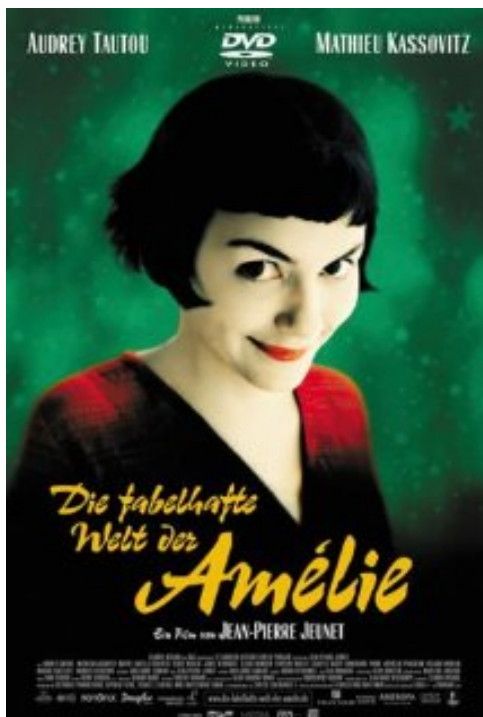


Tuesday, February 22 4:00-6:00, CHAO Auditorium
